He was one of only seven of the original members of Company H when it surrendered in April 1865. Watkins's memoir was written in the winter of 1882 - 83. The humor and depth of writing at times rises to a level resembling Mark Twain; thus, twenty-first century readers can still discover the everlasting treasures of Private Sam Watkins's story just as it was. It is this reason that excerpts were featured frequently in Ken Burns's documentary on the Civil War.
